Dear Dr. Steven Cliff:

The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (Sac Metro Air District) is pleased to submit the final Sacramento Regional 2015 NAAQS 8-Hour Ozone Attainment and Reasonable Further Progress Plan (Plan) and supporting documents. This plan was developed collaboratively with our partner agencies in the Sacramento Federal Nonattainment Area (SFNA): El Dorado County Air Quality Management District, Feather River Air Quality Management District, Placer County Air Pollution Control District, and Yolo-Solano Air Quality Management District along with assistance from your staff.

The Plan demonstrates that (i) existing control strategies and new state control measures will provide necessary emissions reductions of nitrogen oxides and volatile organic compounds to meet the Federal Clean Air Act requirements for reasonable further progress for milestones years of 2023, 2026, and 2029, and (ii) attainment by 2032. The Plan also includes two contingency measures: air districts' commitments to amend local architectural coatings rules and the State's update to the Smog Check Program. In addition, the Plan establishes new motor vehicle emissions budgets, which ensure emissions from regional transportation plans and projects will not delay the timely attainment of the ozone standard.

The Plan was adopted by the Board of Directors of the Sac Metro Air District on September 28, 2023, after a public hearing. The Sac Metro Air District received one comment during the public comment period. The comment was addressed. No further comments were received during the public hearing. Enclosed are the final Sacramento Regional 2015 NAAQS 8 Hour Ozone Attainment and Reasonable Further Progress Plan and the supporting documents from Sac Metro Air District. The other SFNA air districts are scheduled to adopt the Plan separately in October 2023, and they have or will submit their corresponding supporting documents accordingly.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023 – 007

Adopted by the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District

Board of Directors

Sacramento Regional 2015 NAAQS 8-Hour Ozone Attainment and Reasonable Further Progress Plan (Plan)

BACKGROUND:

- A. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) promulgated the 2015 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for ozone on October 26, 2015, with an 8-hour averaging time of 0.070 parts per million (80 Federal Register (FR) 65292).
- B. The Sacramento Federal Nonattainment Area (SFNA) is comprised of Sacramento and Yolo counties, western portions of El Dorado and Placer counties, the southern portion of Sutter County, and the northeastern portion of Solano County (83 FR 25776 25848, June 4, 2018).
- C. The ozone concentrations in the SFNA exceed the primary NAAQS for the 2015 8-hour ozone standard, and the SFNA is currently designated nonattainment for ozone with a "serious" classification, which has an attainment deadline of August 3, 2027 (86 FR 59648-59651, October 28, 2021).
- D. Preliminary photochemical modeling results do not support attainment of the standard by the "serious" classification attainment date. The SFNA air districts have voluntarily requested a reclassification to "severe" with attainment deadline of August 3, 2033. This request is pending EPA action.
- E. EPA promulgated the 2015 Ozone NAAQS Nonattainment Area State Implementation Plan Requirements Rule, which includes requirements pertaining to attainment demonstration, reasonable further progress (RFP) toward attainment, reasonably available control measures (RACM), emissions inventories, contingency measures, and the timing of State Implementation Plan (SIP) submissions (83 FR 62988 63036, December 6, 2018).
- F. The SFNA air districts have prepared the Sacramento Regional 2015 NAAQS 8-Hour Ozone Attainment and RFP Plan to satisfy the attainment and RFP demonstration requirements associated with the "severe" classification (Clean Air Act (CAA) Sections 172(c) and 182).
- G. The Plan uses a 2017 base year and provides emissions inventory forecasts for volatile organic compounds (VOC) and nitrogen oxides (NO_X) (ozone precursor pollutants) for 2023, 2026, 2029, and 2032. These forecasts indicate a significant decline in emissions.
- H. Photochemical modeling conducted by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) indicated that the combined reductions from existing local strategies, regional, state, and federal control measures, and new State control measure commitments are sufficient to demonstrate attainment by 2032 and that no new regulatory VOC or NOx control measures at the regional and local level are proposed for this Plan.

- I. The 2032 attainment year is the year before the regulatory attainment date of August 3, 2033, for a "severe" nonattainment area (CAA Sections 172a(2)(A) and 181).
- J. The Plan demonstrates that existing control programs and new State control measure commitments will provide the future VOC and NO_X emission reductions necessary to meet the federal CAA requirements for reasonable further progress of reducing emissions by at least 3% each year and demonstrated RFP at the 2023, 2026, and 2029 milestone years, and 2032 attainment year (CAA Section 182a(c)(2)(B)).
- K. The RACM analysis showed that the estimated emission reductions from potential control measures remain less than the threshold for advancing attainment.
- L. This Plan sets motor vehicle emissions budgets (MVEBs) for 2023, 2026, 2029, and 2032, and the budgets are consistent with the emissions inventories and applicable RFP and attainment requirements (CAA Section 176).
- M. The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District commits to amend the architectural coating rule (Rule 442) to include contingency measure provisions and will evaluate additional potential options for contingency measures after EPA finalizes the contingency measures guidance.
- N. Staff published a notice of public hearing for the Plan on August 22, 2023, inviting public comments and providing a 30-day period to submit written comments on the Plan.
- O. The Board of Directors held a public hearing on September 28, 2023, and considered public comments on the proposed Plan in accordance with federal Clean Air Act Section 110(i) and 40 CFR 51.102.
- P. Staff of the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District, at 777 12th Street, Sacramento, CA 95814 maintains the record of the proceedings upon which this decision is based.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1 The Board of Directors of the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District adopts the Sacramento Regional 2015 NAAQS 8-Hour Ozone Attainment and Reasonable Further Progress Plan, including the 2017, 2023, 2026, 2029, and 2032 emissions inventories, photochemical modeling results, attainment demonstration, reasonable further progress demonstrations for 2023, 2026, 2029, and 2032, and motor vehicle emissions budgets for milestone years 2023, 2026, and 2029 and attainment year 2032.
- Section 2. The Plan meets the State Implementation Plan (SIP) requirements in the federal Clean Air Act Section 110, and the SIP planning requirements for nonattainment areas in CAA Sections 172, 176, 181, and 182 and 40 CFR Part 51 Subpart CC.

Section 3. The adoption of the Plan is exempt from California Environmental Quality Acts under the California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, §15061(b)(3) and §15308.

Section 4. The Board of Directors directs Staff to forward this Plan and all necessary supporting documents to the CARB for submittal to the EPA as a revision to the California State Implementation Plan to satisfy the requirements of the Clean Air Act.

Section 5. The Board of Directors authorizes the Air Pollution Control Officer in consultation with the District Counsel to make any minor editorial and formatting changes to the Plan prior to submittal to the CARB for submittal to EPA.

The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District will hold a public hearing to consider adoption of the Sacramento Regional 2015 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) 8-Hour Ozone Attainment and Rassumable Further Progress Plan (Plan). The Plan shows how the Sacramenta Federal Nanattainment Area (SFNA), which comprises of Sacramenta and Yold counties, and portions of El Donato, Placer, Solano, and Sutter counties, will attain the 2015 Ozone NAAQS by the attainment date of August 3, 2033.

The Plan documents how the SFNA meets the Clean Air Act (CAA) requirements in demonstrating Reasonable Further Progress (RFP) and attainment of the 2015 ozone NAAGS of 70 parts per billion. The Plan includes ambient ozone data and trends, baseline and forecasted emissions inventories, photochemical modeling, attainment demonstration supported by a weight of evidence analysis, general and transportation conformity requirements, vehicle miles traveled offset demonstration, control measure analysis, and statewide and local confingency measures.

All five SFNA air districts will conduct a public hearing and request their respective boards to take action on the Ptan. If adopted by all five air districts boards, the Ptan will be submitted to the California Air Resources Board (CARB) for approval. If approved, CARB will submit the Ptan to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to the California State Implementation Ptan. This notice, the public hearing, and the Ptan satisfy the requirements under CAA Sections 110, 172, 176, 181, and 182, and Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulation, Part 51, Subpart CC.

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District adopted the Sacramento Regional 2015 8-Hour Ozone Attainment and Reasonable Further Progress (RFP) Plan (Plan), which demonstrates attainment of the 2015 federal health standard, known as the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), for ozone of 70 parts per billion. This Plan meets federal Clean Air Act (CAA) Section 110 requirements for state implementation plans (SIPs), and Sections 172, 176, 181, and 182, and 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 51 Subpart CC planning requirements for the "Severe" classification. This Plan demonstrates that the SFNA will meet the 2015 ozone NAAQS by the end of 2032.

The Plan uses a 2017 emission inventory as the base year and demonstrates that existing control measures as well as new State control measures will provide the Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) and Nitrogen Oxides (NO_X) emission reductions necessary to meet the 2023, 2026, and 2029 RFP milestone years, and 2032 attainment year. This plan includes two contingency control measures: Smog Check Programs amendments if adopted by the State and air districts' commitments to amendment their Architectural Coating Rules. The Plan also establishes new motor vehicle emissions budgets for the milestone and attainment years, which ensure the emissions from regional transportation plans and projects will not delay the timely attainment of the ozone standard.

The Plan is the region's roadmap to meet the 2015 federal ozone health standard, and it will improve air quality by lowering ambient ozone concentration and protect health and property of residents, workers, and businesses owners in the SFNA.

Reasons why project is exempt:

The adoption of the Sacramento Regional 2015 8-Hour Ozone Attainment and Reasonable Further Progress Plan is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as an action by a regulatory agency for the protection of the environment (Class 8 Categorical Exemption, Section 15308, State CEQA Guidelines) and because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant adverse effect on the environment (Section 15061(b)(3), State CEQA Guidelines).
