On October 16, 2020, the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (District) submitted its Request for State Resources for Inclusion of Additional Communities of the Sacramento Region in Year 3 of the AB 617 Community Air Protection Program (CAPP) to the California Air Resources Board (CARB). In the submittal, the District proposed three additional community areas with the highest air pollution burden for air monitoring communities. The areas identified are North Sacramento, Oak Park/Fruitridge, and Meadowview. The District is forwarding additional information for general boundary considerations based on community feedback received since the submittal:


