



## **Draft Clarity PM<sub>2.5</sub> Data**




Draft Clarity PM<sub>2.5</sub> Concentrations - All Clarities

Orange = AQI 101-150




#### Draft Clarity PM<sub>2.5</sub> Concentrations - Area Averages






