The main agenda topics for this meeting were:

- The formation of a Technical Advisory Group (TAG)
- A review of the updated Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) and public comments
- The AB617 budget

**Meeting Takeaways:**

- The Steering Committee reviewed the process and considerations to form a TAG.
- The District reviewed common comments on the CAMP and how the District was addressing the comments. The District did not review all comments it received but stated that the complete comments and responses were available in the meeting materials.
- The Steering Committee members, invited peer-reviewers, and public commented on the revised CAMP and asked clarifying questions.
- The District requested that the Steering Committee vote to recommend forwarding the CAMP to CARB for submittal.
- The District provided an overview of the AB617 budget and potential impacts of the state budget on the funding available to the District.

**Action Items:**

- Vincent Valdez will report back to the Steering Committee on progress toward creating a TAG.
- In response to a question from the public, the District stated that it would review air quality data in the community during two fires that occurred near the community.
- The District stated that it would provide a list of people to contact with concerns about AB617 funding.

**Steering Committee Decisions:**

- The meeting notes from the April 14 and April 28 Steering Committee meetings were approved unanimously.
- The Steering Committee approved the formation a design team to develop recommendations for creating a TAG. The vote was not to approve the specific process and considerations presented during the meeting.
- The District's request that the Steering Committee provide a recommendation to forward the CAMP to CARB was approved. The motion was passed with six votes for it, one against it, and one abstention. Some Steering Committee members who voted for the motion noted that part of the monitoring process should address the communities most impacted and that it was probably an issue for the TAG to address.
