The main agenda topics for this meeting were:

- American Cancer Society Presentation
- City of Sacramento Presentation
- Sacramento County Presentation

Meeting Takeaways:

- The Committee held a vote and provided a recommendation for the District on the application from The Power Inn Alliance.
- The District provided updates on the following:
 - o Electronic versions of all required forms will be sent to SC members once they are available. This includes the Participation Agreement, Conflict of Interest, Payee Data, and Stipend Agreement forms.
 - The District announced they will be cohosting a Climate Justice and Jobs Summit on March 30, 2021. The summit will include local organizations, elected officials, and agency partners discussing community needs regarding equitable and sustainable employment opportunities.
- Vincent Valdez provided an update on the status of the Technical Advisory Group (TAG). A memorandum of understanding and the roles and responsibilities of the TAG are being developed.
- The American Cancer Society presented on how environmental justice (EJ) communities with disproportionate air pollution, mainly from cars and trucks, experience health inequities and higher rates of cancer. Socioeconomic factors such as race and access to healthy food also impact cancer rates in EJ communities.
- Sacramento County presented on the county's authority regarding land use decisions, the environmental review process for development projects, and the Sacramento County 2030 General Plan.
- The City of Sacramento discussed the project timeline and opportunities for community involvement with the city's upcoming 2040 General Plan update. The city is updating the environmental justice element of the general plan and has established an Environmental Justice Working Group to help identify priority EJ communities and provide input on proposed EJ policies.
- For the April agenda topics, the District will send a survey to Committee members to provide feedback on which topics they would like prioritized for the agenda.
- Victoria Vasquez from Sacramento Tree Foundation suggested incorporating public comment throughout the meeting and urged Committee members to invite community members from their networks to attend the meetings and increase public participation.
- Steering Committee Member Tido Thac Hoang gave an acknowledgement of the hate crimes perpetuated against members of the Asian Pacific Islander (AAPI) community that have occurred locally and nationwide in recent weeks.

Action Items:

- Rhonda Henderson will lead the Outreach Subgroup and provide a report back at the April meeting.
- District staff will work with co-leads to identify a COVID-safe way for Committee members to view the Phase 3 mobile monitor.

Steering Committee Decisions:

- The application from the Power Inn Alliance to join the Committee was approved unanimously.
- The meeting notes from the February 23, 2021 Steering Committee meeting were approved unanimously.
