What is Assembly Bill 617?

- Legislative Statute Health and Safety Code (C. Garcia, 2017)
 - Community focused framework
 - Reduce exposure in disadvantaged communities most impacted by air pollution
- Requirements for the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and Air Districts to implement program
 - Aggressive timeframes
 - Community outreach
 - Multi-year process

AB 617 Partnerships

CARB

- Statewide Strategy for a Community Action Framework
- Develop Monitoring Plan
- Select priority communities for monitoring and action plans
- Maintain Emission Control Technology Clearinghouse
- Establish statewide annual emission reporting for certain categories

Air Districts

- Provide recommendations for communities & conduct outreach
- Implementation of community monitoring
- Best Available Retrofit Control Technology (BARCT) implementation
- Develop Community Action Plans

Community

- Provide recommendations for communities (self nomination)
- Provide expertise, experience and additional sources of data and local knowledge



Purpose of Community Air Monitoring

- Assess local community-level pollution
- To better understand local emission sources
- Help determine if a Community Action Plan is needed
- Inform public & track progress







Legislative Directed Consultation (Community Selection)

- Submit initial recommendations to CARB by April 2018
 - Air Districts based on preliminary technical criteria
 - Community Self-Recommendations
- Host community workshops
- Incorporate feedback into final recommendations
- Final recommendations to District Board July 26, 2018
- Submit final recommendations to CARB by July 31, 2018

Goals of Community Inclusion & Engagement


- Involve communities in selection process
- Receive feedback and input on criteria and area recommendations for community monitoring
- Gain a robust understanding of community priorities, needs, and concerns
- Provide input for emission reduction action plans to reduce local pollution burden


Preliminary Analytical Considerations


- CalEnviroScreen 3.0 (Disadvantaged Communities DAC)
- District knowledge of Emission Sources
- Known contributors (road and railways)
- Health information
- Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)
- Healthy Places Index
- Other community input


General Area Concepts for Initial Recommendation

- A map or general description of communities in Sacramento County (e.g. heat map)
- No assumption of community priorities and needs
- Use map as a discussion point with community leaders and residents

- Work with District Board and local communities to host community meetings in April and May 2018
- Initial community recommendations to CARB by April
- Final community recommendations to District Board in July
- Final recommendations to CARB by July 31, 2018
- CARB Board selects communities September 2018
