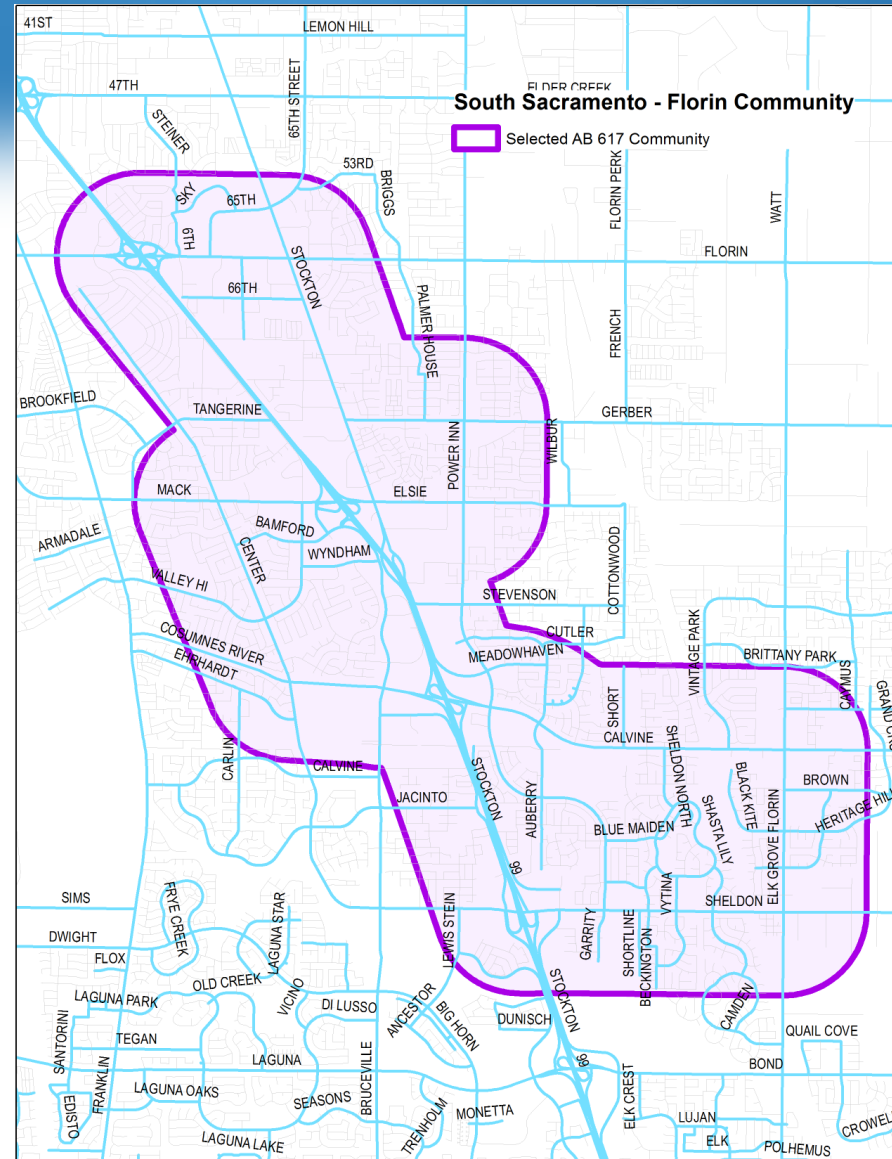
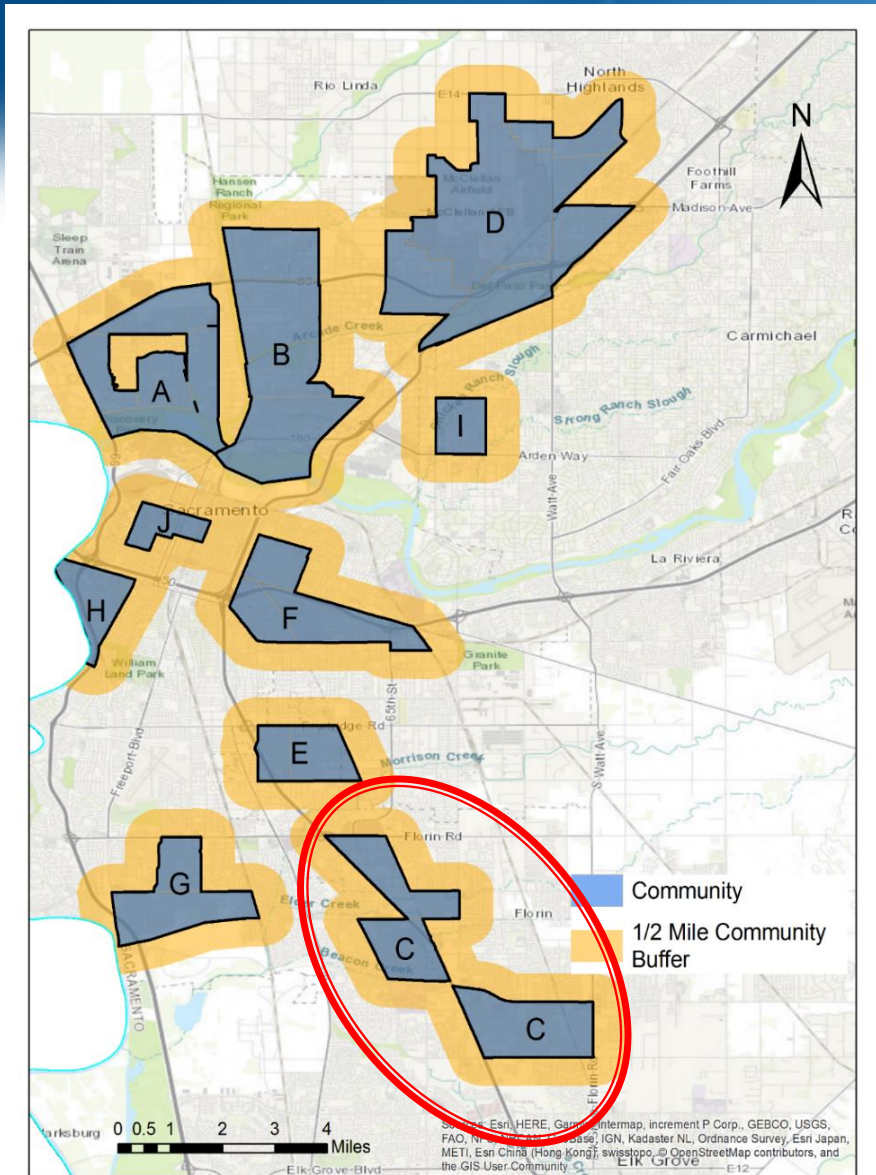

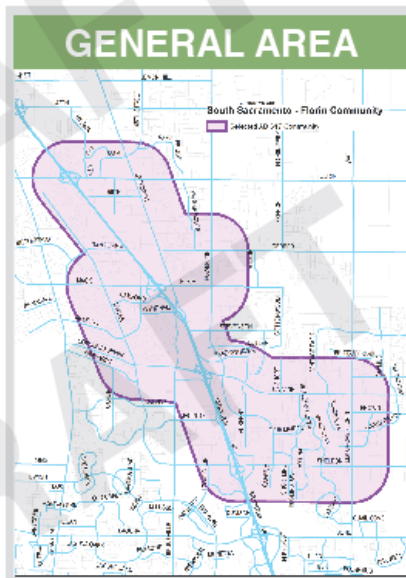


Your neighborhood knowledge will help the Sac Metro Air District develop a plan to monitor and improve air quality in your community. This is an excellent opportunity to:
