## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF STATIONARY DIESEL AGRICULTURAL ENGINES GREATER THAN 50 HORSEPOWER

#### **Replacement Information**

#### Requirement

The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (SMAQMD) has previously notified you regarding the California Air Resources Board Air Toxic control Measure (ATCM) for Stationary Compression Ignition Engines. The ATCM requires the removal of Tier 1 and Tier 2 diesel agricultural (ag) engines from service.

#### **Replacement Options**

Tier 1 and Tier 2 engines may be replaced with a Tier 4 engine. **Not all Tier 4 engines offered for sale meet the ATCM emission standard for ag engines.** Some early model Tier 4 and interim Tier 4 engines do not comply. Before you purchase a Tier 4 engine, please check that it meets the applicable emission standard. The emission standards and compliance dates are listed in the table below.
