The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (Sac Metro Air District) is pleased to submit the South Sacramento-Florin CERP for your review and consideration.

The CERP represents a collaborative effort between the South Sacramento-Florin Community Steering Committee (Steering Committee), community members, the Sac Metro Air District, community-based organizations, and agency partners to develop targeted strategies to reduce emissions and exposure in South Sacramento-Florin that address community-identified air pollution concerns. Through a community-led framework, the Steering Committee and the Sac Metro Air District have worked diligently to ensure that the strategies reflect local needs and will deliver meaningful air quality improvements for the community.

The CERP is consistent with the statewide strategy and satisfies the requirements pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 44391.2. It includes all required elements such as the community profile, Steering Committee background, community outreach and engagement activities, a community-level emissions inventory, emissions and exposure reduction strategies, targets, implementation schedule, and an enforcement plan. This plan outlines a comprehensive set of strategies across key areas of community air pollution concerns, including Urban Planning and Mobile Sources, Residential Sources, Commercial Sources, and Outreach, with a focus on achieving near and long-term emission and exposure reductions. This plan also includes commitments

to continued community outreach and engagement, transparent progress tracking, and adaptive implementation to ensure accountability and effectiveness.

The South Sacramento Community Steering Committee approved moving the CERP to the Sac Metro Air District Board of Directors on March 23, 2026. The Sac Metro Air District Board of Directors approved the CERP on May 28, 2026.

We appreciate the guidance and support provided by CARB throughout the development of this CERP and look forward to continued partnership during implementation of this plan. We respectfully request CARB's review and approval of the enclosed CERP.
