Meeting Summary

1. Welcome and Introductions

A Co-Lead opened the meeting at 6:04 pm. The facilitator welcomed everyone, and the interpreter provided interpretation instructions in English and in Spanish for both online and in-room participation. The facilitator reviewed the code of conduct and agenda. A Co-Lead conducted roll call for the Steering Committee. The facilitator invited the public to share any community events. These are listed below:

Community Events

- *A member shared that there is a rally on May 4, 12:00-1:00 pm at the State Capitol in support of SB895.*

2. Administrative Items

2a. Approval of Meeting Summary

- Approved by Steering Committee vote.

2b. 2026 Implementation Process and Reset

- A Co-Lead introduced the idea of a visioning session to help the Steering Committee reset and build rapport, without the formalities of the formal meeting, before moving into CERP implementation. Member discussions centered around what a visioning session could include, ie., a panel of presenters from other community steering committees; and when this visioning session should take place. No final date was identified. The District encouraged that the visioning session be held in-person.

3. Updates

3a. District Updates

- Steering Committee members shared that they had a positive experience on the SMUD tour and felt that the information provided was helpful. District staff shared that SMUD will be invited back to the Steering Committee.
- District staff shared that at the June 22 meeting date, we will have an “official” hand-off and celebration of the CERP to CARB executive leadership. CARB leadership and local elected officials will be in attendance.
- District staff provided an update regarding the Mangan Park Our Community CarShare Sacramento Site. Additional public outreach was completed and as a result usage has increased.
- District staff provided a brief overview of the sewer pipeline rehabilitation project and the air quality permit (#26586) being issued for the project. The pipe will be rehabilitated without having to be dug up and replaced, which dramatically reduces emissions during rehabilitation. The emissions are within the range.
 - o District will share back to the Steering Committee information from the Sewer District about how they approved this permit; particularly on the number of trees to be removed during the project.
- District staff provided an update on the Electrification of Household Appliances (R-3a) Strategy. They indicated that the title had been updated to allow for additional future partners.

3b. Outreach Subcommittee Updates

- The District shared that the following topics were discussed at the Outreach Subcommittee this month: CERP Strategy 0-4 Complaints System, Sac Sewer Repair Project, CERP Celebration Event on June 22, Comment Letters- Quick Quack Carwash, and Valley Vision Outreach Tracking.
- District and Steering Committee members discussed how to improve the Outreach Subcommittee, including reimbursement for members' expenses and improving the involvement of members in specific outreach events, including requiring there be at least two Steering Committee members at each outreach event. A Steering Committee member shared their positive experience at a recent outreach event.

3c. CERP Subcommittee Updates

- The District shared that the following topics were discussed at the CERP Subcommittee meeting this month– Quick Quack follow up, Community Car Share data, CERP Implementation Process and a Strategy Discussion that included the C-2 Public Information Portal.

4. Discussion Items

4a. Strategy Follow-Up

- *Public Information Portal and Complaint System* - District staff provided an update on the Public Information Portal and the Complaint System. They are currently in early-stage implementation. Discussed how they incorporated feedback from the Steering Committee on accessibility and inclusivity; ease of use; communication and transparency; and access options.

4b. Quick Quack Carwash Comment Letter and Follow-Up

- District staff shared that this topic was discussed at both subcommittee meetings, and a comment letter was developed on behalf of the Steering Committee. If the letter is approved by the Steering Committee, it will be submitted to the City of Sacramento on April 28 for the council meeting.

5. Action Items and Next Steps

5a. Vote to Approve Quick Quack Carwash Comment Letter

Approved by Steering Committee vote.

6. New Business and Upcoming Meeting Topics

- Virtual office hours remain available by appointment through the Clerk.
- The District announced the upcoming meetings.

7. Public Comments

- A community member provided an update on the Community Air Grant, sharing that four community ambassadors have been onboarded who are available to help with tabling and outreach. A kickoff meeting with the graphic designer and videographer took place. They will be supporting outreach and communications for AB 617. A survey was distributed to members regarding current Steering Committee AB 617 branding. A videographer is developing a short video telling the story of AB 617 in Sacramento.
- A community member presented on a Bill that restricts electric vehicle (EV) charging access by not requiring all apartment complexes to have EV charging stations. She is part of a coalition that is opposing the bill because they believe it is inequitable.
 - There was a discussion among the Steering Committee about the affordability or lack thereof of electric vehicles for underserved populations. The Steering Committee

discussed full support for EV charging stations for all folks.
