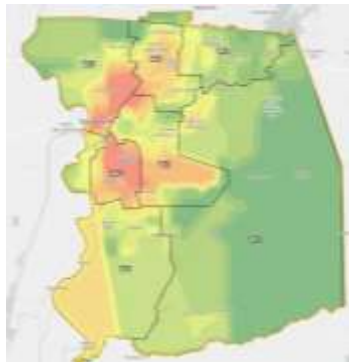

Neighborhood Approach



Select a group of homes in a red zone:

- Age of home
- % Energy Assistance Program Rate
- % inefficient cooling



Avondale / 95824



Priority neighborhoods:

- Gardenland - **Completed**
- North Highlands - **Completed**
- Meadowview - **Completed**
- Avondale – **Full Swing**
- Strawberry Manor – **Full Swing**
- Fruitridge Manor - **TBD**
- Lawrence Park - **TBD**

- Engage community to create support and recruit homeowners and property owners
- Conduct energy assessment of each home/business
- Assign contractors to perform direct installation of equipment; Measures may include 1 or more:
 - Heat Pump Space Heating
 - Heat Pump Water Heater
 - Induction Stove/ commercial cooking equipment
 - EV ready
 - Solar (<10% of customers)
- Address urban heat through tree planting
- Educate community on climate change impacts, monitoring energy usage, the benefits of electrification;

Neighborhood Electrification - Avondale



- Originally, the map included the immediate area surrounding Max Baer Park
- Has expanded to entire 95824 Zip Code
- Neighborhood Outreach Efforts
 - Bridges Network Food Closet, SCUSD Elder Creek Elementary, Lu Mein Community Services - Senior Program at George Sims Community Center, Eagles Hall, Welco Market, Door-to-Door canvassing

Energy Assistance Program Rate (EAPR)

- Based on household income
- Discount on a qualified customer's energy bill

* Beginning January 2024, the 0-50% federal poverty level is a combined EAPR program and EAPR Rate Stabilization Fund discount up to \$105.

Energy Saver Bundle – Three Prescriptive Approaches



- **Renter - Apartment:** Eligible for an advanced power strip, fan and LED light bulbs. Multi-Family projects for entire complex are available through other channels.
- **Renter - House:** Eligible for a programmable thermostat, advanced power strip, LED light bulbs, insulation and minor efficiency upgrades.
- **Homeowner:** Eligible for some heating and cooling repairs or replacements, energy efficiency upgrades (or fuel switching from gas to electric appliances) and electrical vehicle chargers.

Challenges

Customer feedback indicates the following beliefs:

- Program is too good to be true.
- Lack of trust – many have been scammed by dishonest contractors in the past.
- Costs – customers expect that there might be some hidden expense or lien on their homes.

SMUD Account and Property Title Ownership

- SMUD program requires the customer of account also be the legal owner of the property or reside at the property.
- It can present challenges especially with multi-generational homes.

Other Challenges include:

- Fenced in homes that prevent face to face interaction when canvassing.
- Language barriers prevent accurate communication.
- Technological advances and newer ways to use energy efficient equipment when customers are accustomed to older technology.

SMUD could use some assistance with navigating the community by identifying the following:

Incentive Guidelines – Guiding Principles

- Reduce Emissions in AB 617
- Consider toxic air contaminant, criteria air pollutant, and greenhouse gas reduction benefits
- Engage communities, provide support, and foster partnerships
- Consider special projects to protect sensitive receptors
- Consider cost-effectiveness and relative exposure reduction or mitigation
- Prioritizing communities
 - Prioritize CAP Incentives in CERP selected communities (AB 617)
 - Focus on communities consistently nominated and those currently considered for future selection (AB 1550/SB 535)

Funding Allocation

- CERP CAP Year 1 Budget
 - Total available: \$2,350,000
- Required Allocation
 - \$1,880,000 or more must be in Disadvantaged Communities (DAC)
 - \$470,000 or less may be in the remaining CERP area

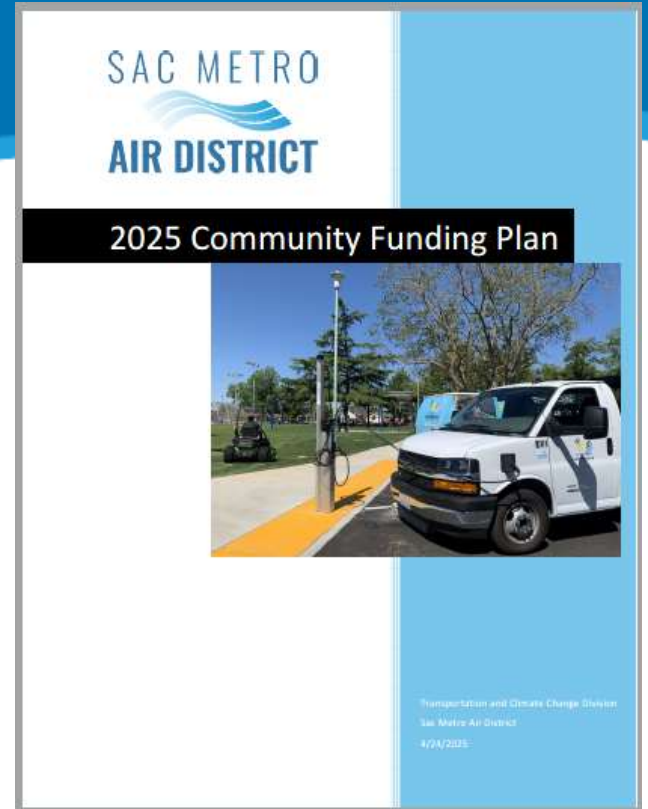
