Discussion Items

Announcement: July 25 CARB Board Meeting, South Sacramento-Florin was officially designated as CERP and CAMP community. We have funds to develop and submit a CERP to the state.

Discussion Item #1: Budget

- Adriana Smith, CARB, Community Liaison for South Sacramento-Florin Community gave a
 presentation on the three types of air quality grants: Community Air Grants, Community
 Air Protection (CAP) Incentives, Air District Implementation Funds
- Erika Trinidad, CARB, gave a presentation on CommunityHub 2.0 which is a resource website for participants in the Community Air Protection Program.

 - The Internet connection was lost during the meeting and some of the presentation was not captured. CARB Staff will send a doodle poll to steering committee members to see if they'd like to meet to discuss this further.
- David Yang, Sacramento Metro Air Quality Management District presented on the funding received for implementation and Jamie Lemus, Sacramento Metro Air Quality Management presented on the funding received for incentives.

Steering Committee Members Questions/Discussion

- There was question about the implementation funding for monitoring in the expanded area. The
 District responded that implementation funds can be used to cover air monitoring, including the
 cost to operate portable laboratory monitoring. The Steering Committee will need to discuss
 where they would like to relocate the portable monitoring laboratory.
- There was a question if the one time funding was for planning and not for implementation. The District responded that the funding was the development of the CERP and that funding for implementing the CERP will need to be figured out at a later time.
- There was question about how the incentive funds and the type of project that can be covered.
 The District responded that for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023/2024 funds, the funds can be used for
 traditional CAP incentive projects conforming to Moyer and Community Air Protection guideline.
 For FY 2023/2024, the incentive funds can be used for projects identify for the CERP.
- There was a question about the budget project regarding the cost of a FTE (full time employee). The District responded that the District will provide a written response at a later time.
- There was comment to clarify that implementation monies are used to implement these programs, meetings, etc. and incentives dollars are funds to fix what we want to fix.
- There was question about what percentage of the incentive funds can be used in the South Sac-Florin CERP boundaries. CARB responded that 70-80% of funds need to be used in disadvantaged communities and low-income areas in the County/Air District.

Discussion Item #2: CERP sub-committee update: Education, engagement, and recruitment in new areas – Vincent

- September 29, Clean Air Day, proposed opportunity to do education, engagement and recruitment. Community does not automatically know what we're doing. We have to educate them.
- Health Fair at La Familia last year, received good feedback.
- Potential future events: health fair, live music, taco/egg roll contest, invite first responders, farmers markets, etc. Consider having mental health and support for the homeless at the events. We are ready to do projects.

Public Comment

- It was noted that it is difficult to ask questions at the end when we've discussed so much.
- Question was posed: How do we find out who was funded and for how much on the website?
- Suggestion was made to go to where the community already gathers. Table at those already established community events. Consider church community events.
- A question was posed regarding how much of that \$7 million is accounted for by staff time. How
 much does it cost to host these meetings and how much of that is staff time? Observation was
 made that community and that the committee did not well attend the Bowling Green event needs
 to do better. There should be more community members here in a community led project.
- A question was posed inquiring about the nature of the \$250,000 for outreach does the Steering Committee have approval over that?
- Suggestion to pursue Community Air Grant, opening in September, good opportunity to access more money for outreach and engagement.
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 - O Jaime Lemus Within the old boundaries, since 2017 \$7.80 million funds have been spent, in addition to other funds, with the support of this steering committee.

Steering Committee Discussion

- Suggestion regarding community outreach keep in mind that community is different than what we were in 2019 when the SC was created. Consider who is our target audience, then build a strategy that works for that target audience. Consider how we define success for our outreach strategy.
- A suggestion was made to target youth in our outreach.
- Outreach Subcommittee indicated that they are reaching out the business, families and youth. Had over 100 folks visited their table at a recent event.
- Suggestion to follow-up with event attendees. Build follow-up into the process.
- Suggested that we can measure success by changes in behavior.
- CARB Staff clarification the CERPs boundaries were created considering the population. Using those boundaries would be a good place to start for prioritizing outreach. It is also a metric to measure progress over time.
- Suggested that repetitive messages are the most effective means.

CERP Subcommittee Updates

Most of items discussed in subcommittee meeting had already been shared earlier in this
meeting. Discussed CERP community engagement and new opportunities to get out into the
community. Needing the data to use as an educational tool.
