Meeting Summary

1. Welcome and Introductions

The facilitator welcomed everyone and the interpreter provided interpretation instructions in English and in Spanish for both online and in-room interpretation. The facilitator reviewed the code of conduct and agenda. District staff welcomed our new Co-Lead and thanked our outgoing Co-Lead. A Co-Lead opened the meeting at 6:20 pm. A Co-Lead conducted roll call for the Steering Committee. The facilitator invited the public to share any community events. These are listed below:

- *A member shared that Color the Block is hosting several upcoming events, including an Earth Day Celebration at Rainbow Mini Park on April 19, the second Clean Air Garden event with a BBQ and ground-breaking on March 5, and on April 22, they are co-hosting a science night at Pony Express Elementary.*
- *A member shared that United Latinos is hosting the Dia De la Tierra Event at La Familia Counseling Center on April 11.*

3a. District updates

3b. Outreach Subcommittee Updates

- A member announced that Valley Vision continues CAG planning meetings; CAP luncheon, CERP Workshop, and CERP outreach were conducted during the comment period. The community ambassador program was launched and the website is live.
- Dia de la Tierra event sponsorship was discussed.
- A Co-Lead shared the following upcoming events:
 - Revitalize South Sac, March 5
 - Sweet Potato Festival, March 7
 - Dia de la Tierra, April 11
 - Color the Block Earth Day Celebration, April 19
 - Color the Block Youth Science Night, April 22

4. Action Item

- Vote to Participate in the Dia de la Tierra Event, per Outreach Subcommittee recommendation.
- A Co-lead introduced the opportunity to sponsor the Dia de la Tierra event at \$500. The District clarified that the Charter indicates that since the amount is \$500 or less, there is no need to vote. The recommendation of the Outreach Subcommittee is sufficient to approve this expenditure.

5. Discussion Items

5a. CERP Subcommittee

- District provided updates from the CERP subcommittee, including the Clean Air Partnership (CAP) luncheon, CERP Public Workshop, Valley Vision’s social media ads, Lunar New Year event, and Suzanne Selwright-Sutherland's Academic Project.
- District introduced the strategy co-benefits document, indirect benefits that could be included in the CERP.

5b. Draft CERP Public Comments Received

- District staff presented on the CERP timelines and a summary of public comments received on the Draft CERP.
- District reviewed the public comments that required Steering Committee discussion or decisions. The Steering Committee ranked which comments to address first by using their consensus tools. The following is a photo of the results of the ranking of each public comment:

- The District and Steering Committee discussed the highest-priority comment, which was a comment on UM-9a, Industrial and Warehouse Uses/Zoning, UM-9b, Truck Route Study, and UM-10, Community input on Truck Routes.

- The key takeaways from the Steering Committee discussion were:
 - Align our strategy timelines with AB98 timelines.
 - Suggestions to reallocate funding from the replacement of the heavy-duty truck incentive strategy to a truck route study, but a decision to address this question was deferred to the CERP subcommittee meeting
- Public comment discussion will continue at the CERP Subcommittee on March 2 and at an additional CERP Subcommittee meeting on March 9, if needed.

6. New Business and Upcoming Meeting Topics

- The District reminded the Steering Committee that virtual office hours are by appointment only and can be coordinated through email to the Clerk.
- The District announced the next CERP Subcommittee meeting is March 2, 2026, 6:00-8:00 pm via Zoom. There will be an additional CERP Subcommittee meeting on March 9, 2026, 6:00-8:00 pm via Zoom, if needed to discuss the Public Comments. The next Outreach Subcommittee meeting is March 16, 2026, 6:00-8:00 pm via Zoom. The next Steering Committee meeting is March 23, 2026, 6:00-8:00 pm, hybrid at La Familia Neighborhood Center.

- A public member, Suzanne Selwright-Sutherland, a doctoral candidate researching multi-sectoral groups specific to AB617, is requesting interviews with Steering Committee members to support her research.
