# Accessing an Interpreter



## UM – 3: Increasing Tree Canopy

**Submission # 18, Date: 2/16/2026 (Received after comment period)**

Page 36, received from Herman Barahona, Sacramento Environmental Justice Coalition (Sac-EJC)

*Recommendation: Steering Committee Discussion*

# UM-3 Increasing Tree Canopies

**Submissions #15, received from City of Sacramento (page 15) and #16, received from Sacramento County (page 24)**

- Request that 50% tree canopy be adjusted to a more realistic goal.

*Recommendation: Revise UM-3*

**Submissions #11, received from T.J. Friesen (page 6-7), and #12, received from Jesse Reese (page 7)**

- Suggest strategically planting trees near high-traffic corridors, schools, and transit stops.

*Recommendation: No change needed, determined during implementation*

# UM-6 Reduce Idling at Schools and Sensitive Receptors

## **Submission #17, received from ECOS (page 34)**

- Encourage an action item that involves working with schools to ensure that there are security/monitoring resources dedicated to anti-idling policy enforcement.

*Recommendation: No change, provide response*

## **Submission #3, received from Jesse Reese (page 2)**

- At drive-thrus, you see a lot of vehicles just sitting and idling. This is probably hard to control, but something to think about.

*Recommendation: No change, provide response*

# R-2 Residential Lawn and Garden

## **Submission #10, received from Joey Wraithwall (page 6)**

- Disappointed not to see the CERP seek out to phase out gas-powered lawn equipment, especially leaf blowers, at all. (Submission #10)

*Recommendation: No change, existing regulation CA AB1346 phased out the sale of new gas-powered small off-road engines, including leaf blowers by 2024.*
