Meeting Summary

Meeting started at 6:12pm

Activity

2a. CERP Strategies Presentation

The District presented the same overview of CERP strategies as the February 19 Steering Committee Meeting so that any Steering Committee members or members of the public who were unable to join the previous week would not miss any context. The presentation focused on connecting concerns to strategies. The District reviewed the categorized concerns list, which was based on air quality concerns the Steering Committee and larger community has already expressed.

Following this overview, the District revisited the star sticker activity from the previous meeting and summarized the outcomes of the activity from last meeting, noting top priority categories. The District reviewed the timeline for the tabling activity, discussed the goals of the activity, and encouraged

participants to use the concerns list as a guide to discuss ways to address community concerns.

2b. CERP Strategies Tabling Activity

Tables were split into:

- 1. Outreach & Education,
- 2. Land use & Incentives, and
- 3. Rules & Permitting

The Steering Committee members and members were numbered off and spent approximately 30 minutes at each table, totaling approximately 90 minutes. Each table presenter introduced their topics. After a presentation, the SC members and public members participated in a facilitated brainstorming session to gather ideas about desired actions within the South Sacramento-Florin Community Boundaries or actions they would like to learn more about.
