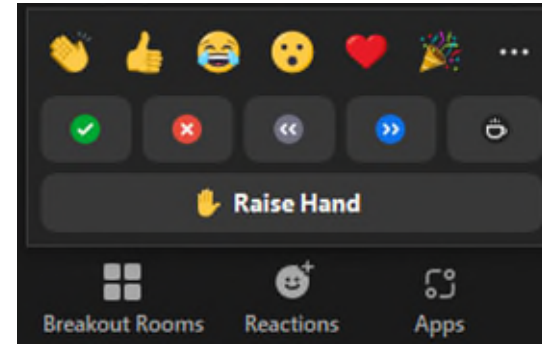

Community Boundary Questions Received at June 4, 2024 Steering Committee Meeting

- Will we be moving the Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) boundaries along with Community Emission Reduction Program (CERP) boundaries?
- Clarify how that would affect funding because the funding does come from two different pots.

CSC Decision will be addressed in Action Item #1

Expanded Boundary – CAP Funding Impacts

AB617 is a state requirement and the state legislature has only provided partial funding

Implementation Funding

- Funding is received by District, not individual AB617 communities
- Monitoring - areas can be prioritized, CSC can directly focus on specific areas, potentially more areas to choose from
- Strategies – can also be prioritized, but in general, resources might need to be spread out to a bigger area
- Strategies can also be prioritized to be focused on key areas

Incentive Funding

- Funding is received by District, not individual AB617 communities
- Incentive funds can be used outside of the AB617 boundaries
- CERP strategies can be funded by CAP incentives, CARB approval needed
- Projects still need to be prioritized within DAC areas in Sacramento

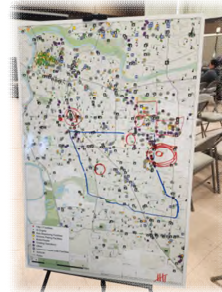

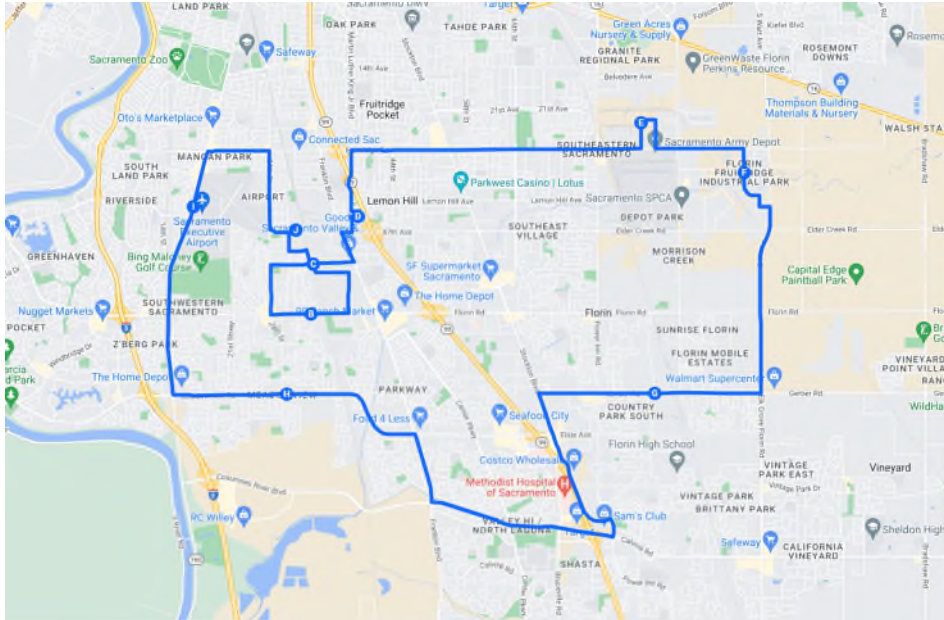

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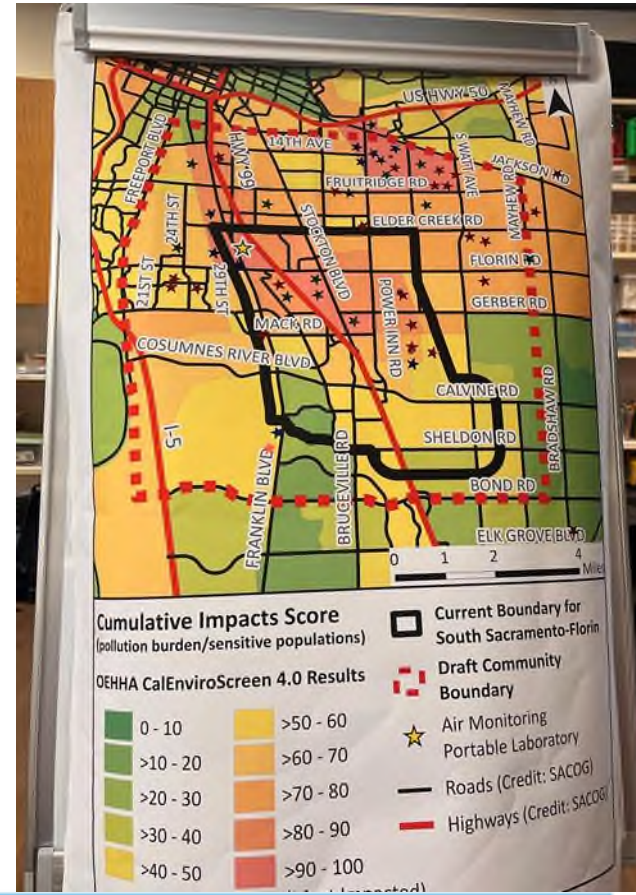
Community Feedback Received from Sac County Public Health Air Quality Event



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Community Feedback Received from La Familia Air Quality Event



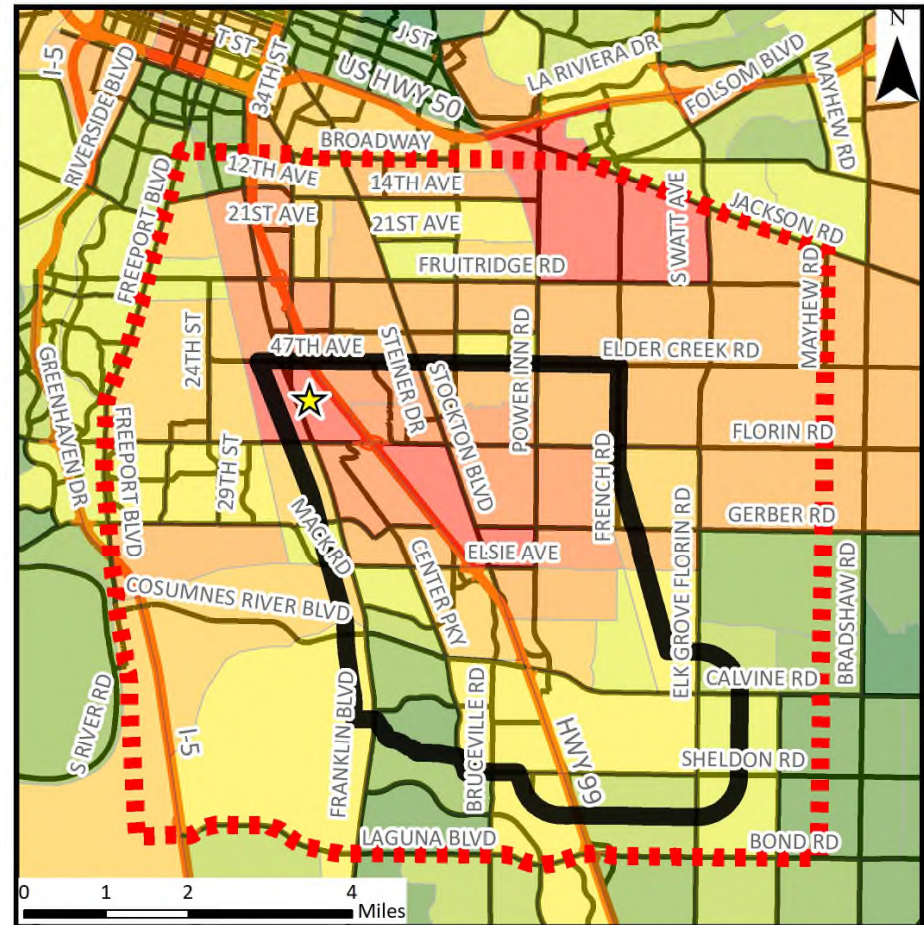
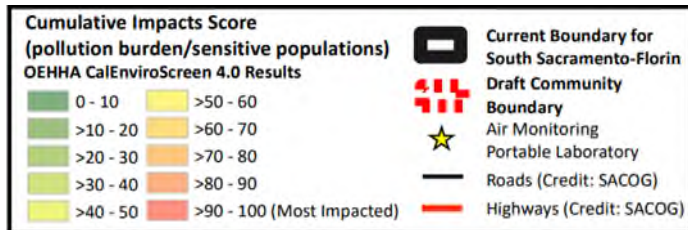

- 2) To finalize the draft boundaries developed on June 4th to be the CERP boundary and new CAMP boundary





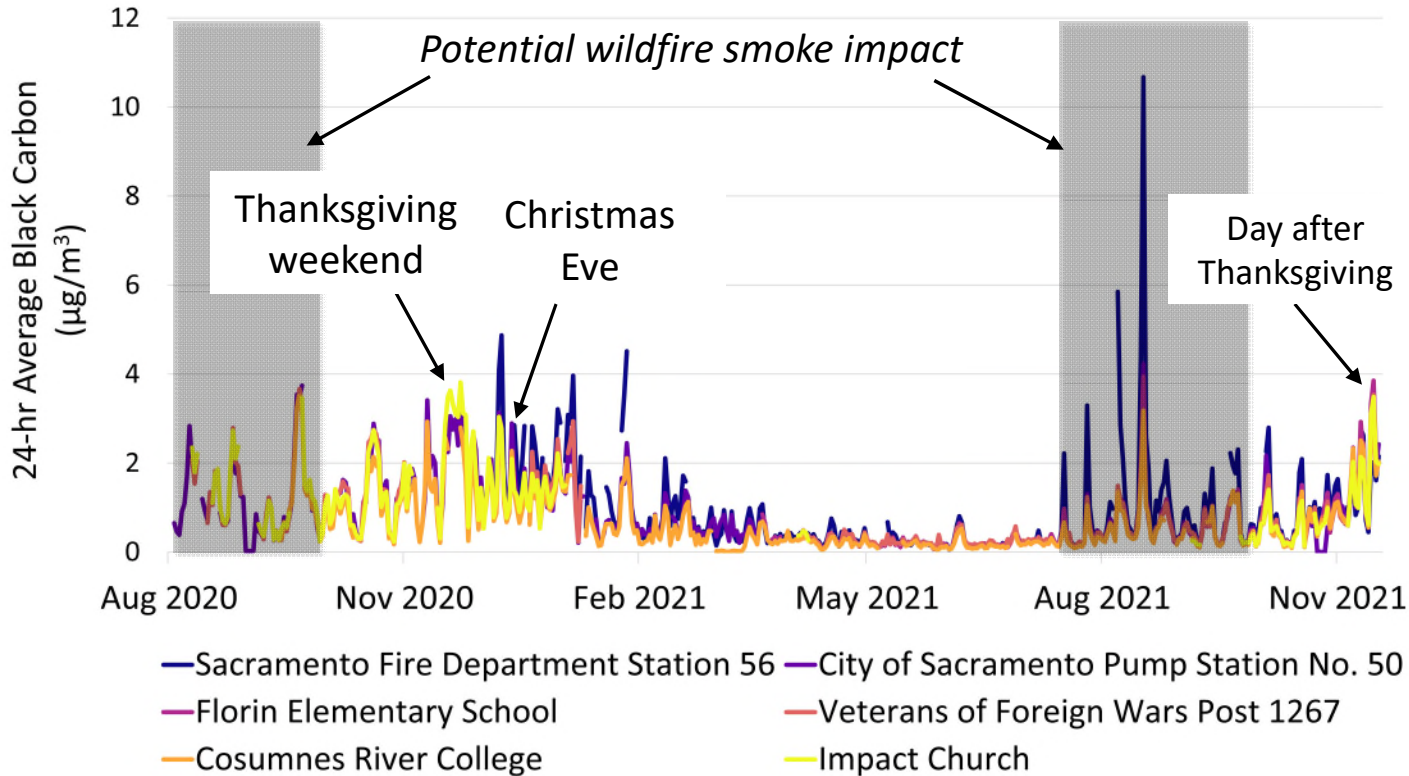

Relevant Permitting Actions Sacramento Area Sewer District (SacSewer)

- SacSewer facility located in proposed boundaries
- Biogen project of interest
- **Now:** power & heat from SMUD
- **Future:** SacSewer makes own power & heat
- Air quality permit applications
 - **Fuel cell** (2.8 MW)
 - 3 Engines (>3000 HP each), use digester and natural gas
 - Back up boiler
- Public notice period starts soon



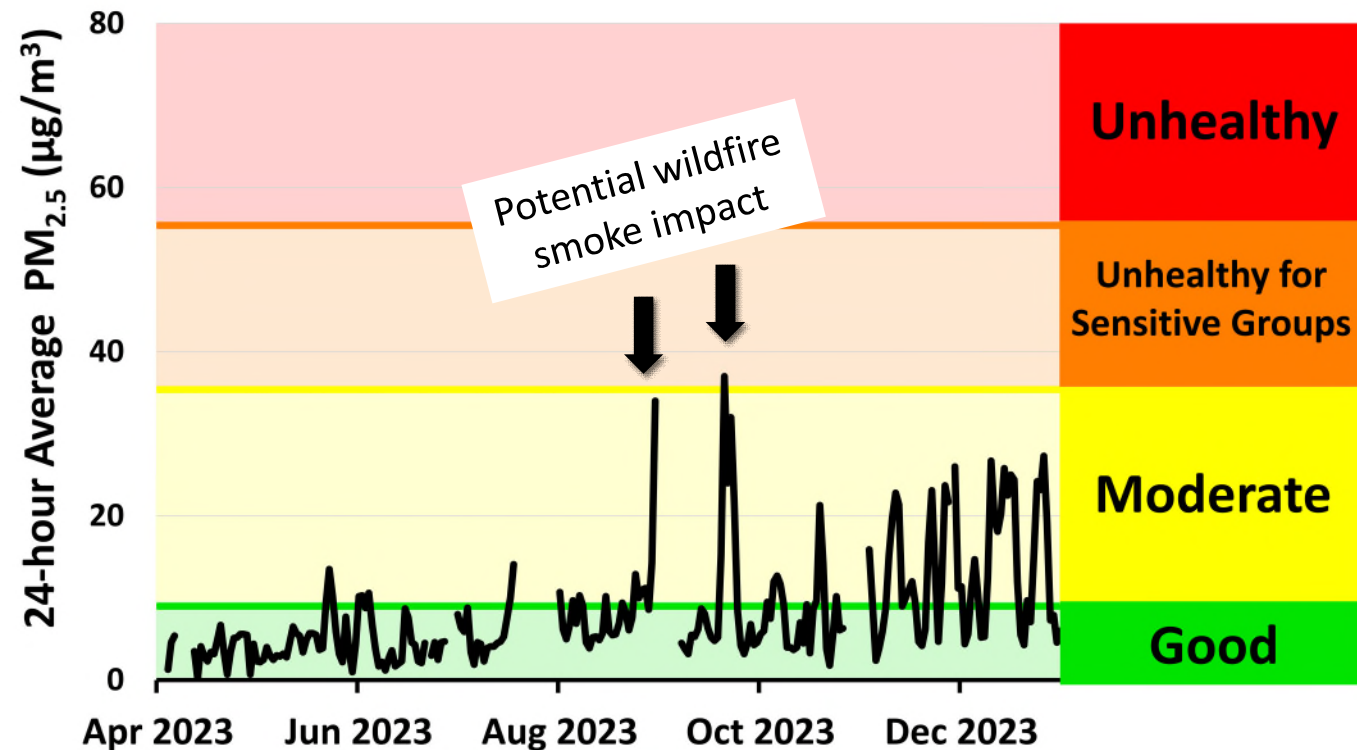
Phase 2 Monitoring: microAeth MA200* continuous monitoring



Black carbon levels greater over colder months (Nov-Feb). Likely **residential wood smoke** contribution and **meteorological** impacts exacerbating pollution from all sources (such as **mobile sources**).

Professional-grade air monitoring equipment at Fern Bacon Middle School: PM_{2.5}

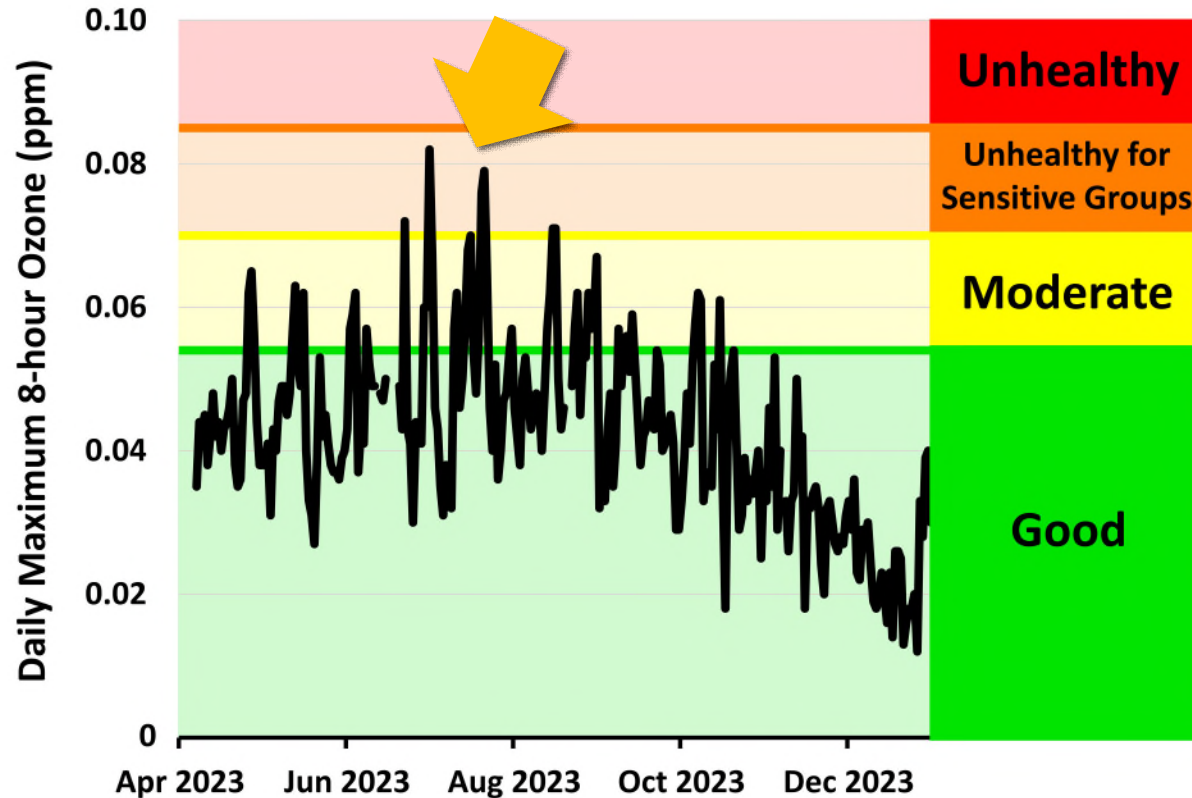


PM_{2.5}

Greatest levels when potential wildfire smoke impact.

Outside of potential wildfire smoke impacts, levels more elevated from October to December.

Above federal health standard
(0.07 ppm)
on six different dates
