

An *incentive* is generally a reason or motivation that encourages a person, agency, or organization to do something benefiting South Sac Clean Air

# Cleaner air inside homes

### Non-Monetary

- Free distribution of air filters or air purifiers in places with more pollution
- Create awards/recognition for apartment complexes that ban smoking
- Permit streamlining for homes constructed without natural gas

### Monetary

- Funding for vegetative barriers between homes and sources of pollution
- Vouchers for replacing household appliances to zeroemission stoves, furnaces, and water heaters
- Discounts for electric fireplace
   inserts

### **Existing Incentives**

Name	Description
Clean Cars 4 All	Scrap cars for transportation vouchers (new car, eBike, transit)
Car Share (OCCS)	Reduced rate for car share rental
Lawn & Garden	Vouchers for electric landscaping equipment
SECAT	Funding for zero-emission equipment
Fireplace Change-out	Remove wood burning appliances
Targeted Green Infrastructure Prog.	Updated transit stops
Moyer - Vehicles	Scrap trucks, buses, equipment, etc and get a new one
FARMER	Scrap agricultural equipment and get a new one
Infrastructure Moyer	Get sustainable fueling or charging equipment
Urban Greening	Planting & Maintenance of Trees

- Need to make a new program
  - Eligibility
  - Required Actions
  - Compensation
  - Tracking & Reporting
  - Penalties for non-compliance
  - Identify funding
  - Get CARB approval
