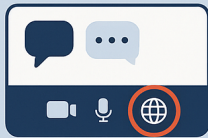

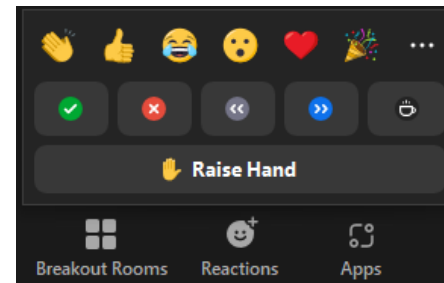

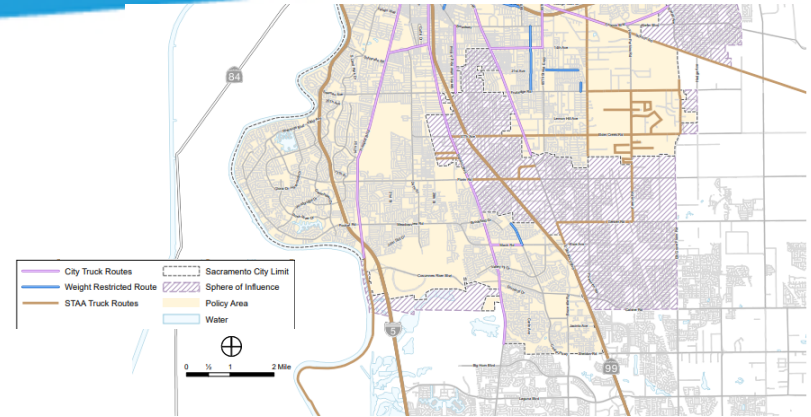

Responses to Public Comments on the Draft Community Emissions Reduction Plan (CERP)


Comment Type	Comment Summaries	Draft Responses	Comment Status
General Comments & Questions	What pollutants are generated by airplanes/airports? Has this topic been coming up in conversation? (Submission #1)	Airports and aircraft emissions have been discussed during Community Steering Committee (CSC) discussions, particularly in relation to the Sacramento Executive Airport. While aircraft and airport activity can contribute to air pollution, the primary concern raised in the South Sacramento-Florin community has been emissions from leaded aviation fuel. Because aviation fuel is regulated at the federal level, local authorities' ability to address that source is limited. The CSC included monitoring for airport emissions in its Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) and has discussed placing a portable air monitor near the Sacramento Executive Airport in the future to better understand air quality conditions in the area.	Clarification and Response Provided.  No changes to Plan
	What areas were encompassed on the school bus tour? Also, the old school buses seem like they were running regularly with bad exhaust. So, the bus that you took, was that an all-electric bus? I hear they do have some electric buses in the school district. Was the tour on an all-electric bus? (Submission #2)	Yes, the tour was conducted using an all-electric school bus. The tour route, including the areas traveled, is posted on the District's website and is also included in Chapter 3 of the CERP. The route was designed to provide CSC members and participants with a view of key areas within the South Sacramento-Florin CAMP boundaries, including locations and corridors relevant to local air quality concerns. Additionally, through its incentive programs, the District helped facilitate the early adoption of all-electric school buses throughout Sacramento County, with every school district in the county participating.	Clarification and Response Provided.  No changes to Plan
	At drive-thrus, you see a lot of vehicles just sitting and idling. There are some newer electric vehicles, but a great deal of pollutants. This is probably hard to control, but something to think about. (Submission #3)	The District agrees that vehicle idling at drive-thrus can contribute to localized air pollution, especially in communities already affected by traffic emissions. While this can be difficult to address directly, the District works with local jurisdictions through development review to encourage designs that reduce reliance on vehicles and improve walkability.	Clarification and Response Provided.  No changes to Plan

- **Alignment with AB 98** and Industrial and Warehouse Use/Zoning strategy
- **Reallocated incentive funds** to the truck route studies strategy

**Goals** (Long-Term)

- Reduce impact of industrial and warehouse uses on the community.
- Determine thresholds.

**Estimated Timeline(s)**

- **2025:** Elk Grove Climate Action Plan public comment in July 2025.
- **2027:** County of Sacramento - Zoning Code Update to South Sacramento Industrial Special Planning Areas (SPAs) and Neighborhood Preservation Areas (NPAs) (simplification, evaluation of existing setback and landscape buffering standards).
- **2027-2028-2029:**
  - City of Sacramento - Implementing General Plan actions (Environmental Justice performance standard study – **2027**).
  - Phase I of a zoning overhaul (simplification, fewer residential zones & objective development standards **2028-2029**).

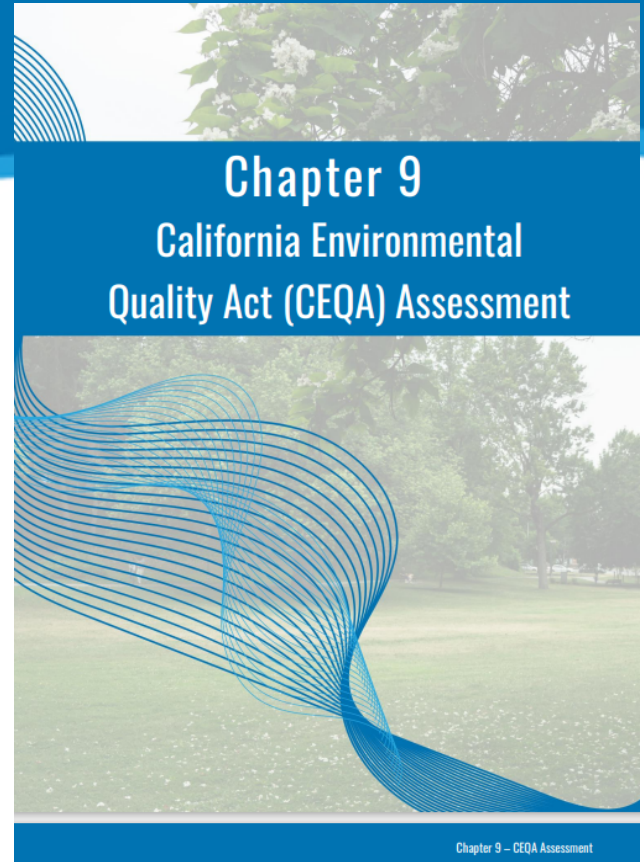
The timeline and the following associated milestones will be established once additional funding becomes available:

- Steering Committee provides recommendations for amendments to the zoning codes, development standards and/or design guidelines for the three jurisdictions within the AB 617 community.
- Have jurisdictions appropriate development standards for specific land uses.

- **Public Information Portal** – accelerated timeline to 2026
- **California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) assessment**
  - CERP is found to be exempt from CEQA
  - Updated Chapter 9
  - Added technical CEQA memo as an attachment in Appendix E



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# Action Item & Next Steps

- **Today:** CSC vote to move Draft Final CERP to Air District Board; CERP is not final until it's adopted by the District Board
- **May 2026:** Air District Board takes action on Proposed CERP.
- **June 2026:** If approved, Final CERP is sent to CARB. CSC Event with CARB leadership
- **July 2026:** CARB's Executive Officer takes action on CERP, and CARB provides its annual update to its Board on South Sacramento-Florin's CERP status/progress
