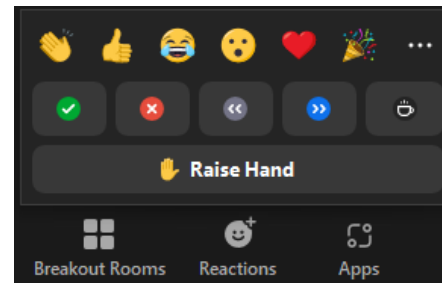

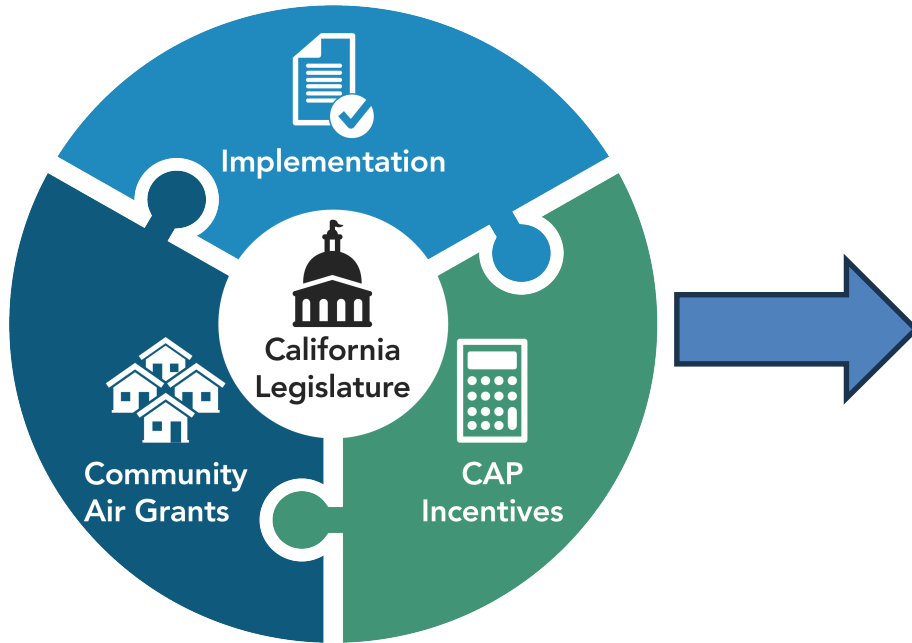
# Feasibility Analysis Summary

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# AB 617 Statewide Community Air Protection (CAP) Funding Update

- **FY 25/26 Air District Implementation** - \$45 Million, **10% reduction**
- **FY 25/26 Community Air Protection Incentives** - \$50 Million, **80% reduction**
- **FY 26/27 and beyond** – Cap and Trade re-authorization - \$250 million, continuous appropriations, **20% reduction**
  - Legislative review in five years
- **New reporting requirements**
- **Minimum 5 years of air monitoring** with an option to extend, pending resources
- **Some Bills - Pending Governor's Signature**

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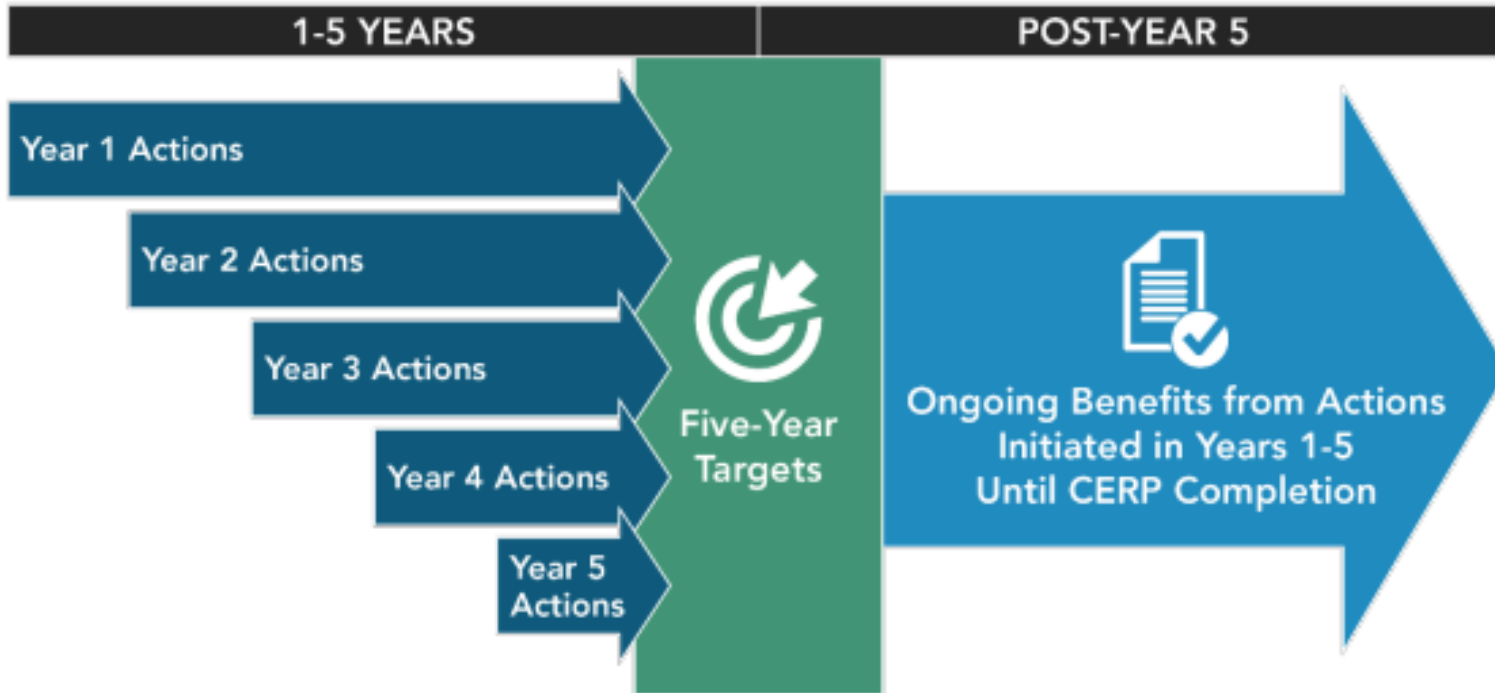
