Recognizing the deep connection between air quality and public health, the Air District listens to and engages with community members disproportionately impacted by environmental issues, working to protect all residents' well-being. Through targeted initiatives and collaboration, the Air District advances equity and ensures a healthier environment for Sacramento County and beyond.

This transformative step advances environmental justice, bringing more residents into the collaborative efforts of the Community Air Protection program. As CERP development begins, public meetings and engagement opportunities will ensure local voices help shape the community's environmental future, strengthening the program's impact and empowering residents.

Innovating the Future

The Air District is committed to driving innovation and sustainability in the Sacramento region. By embracing new technologies, streamlining services, and fostering strategic partnerships, the Air District is advancing efforts to reduce air pollution, address climate change, and support a thriving green economy. Reducing Climate Pollution

The Air District leads climate resilience strategies and clean air solutions in the Sacramento region. Through collaboration with diverse partners, the District is dedicated to enhancing quality of life for all residents. By developing comprehensive local and regional plans, securing funding for innovative projects, and implementing programs to combat environmental challenges, the Air District is committed to reducing air and climate pollution for a sustainable future.



Partnering with Elk Grove, Davis, and Arizona State University, the Air District is developing a program for operating an innovative tool, called MaRTy, to measure mean radiant temperatures, assess pedestrian and cyclist heat exposure, and provide data on heat mitigation success.



Shaping the future of climate action in the Sacramento region through the development of the Capital Region Climate Priorities Plan. The Plan outlines 24 climate measures that would create substantial greenhouse gas emission reductions and a myriad of co-benefits.



Awarding nearly \$15 million in incentive funding for more than 45 projects including electric cars, trucks, and school buses, charging infrastructure, tractors, and agricultural equipment replacements.

Advancing Zero-Emission Technology

To improve air quality and promote a sustainable future in the Sacramento region, the Air District is committed to funding a diverse array of projects that reduce emissions and benefit residents, businesses, nonprofits, and public agencies. These initiatives not only reduce fossil fuel combustion pollution but also support federal air quality standards and state decarbonization goals while fostering economic development. Together with key partners like SACOG, SMUD, and SacRT, the Air District is paving the way for a cleaner, greener Sacramento.

Transforming EV ownership in Sacramento's underserved neighborhoods through Clean Cars 4 All. To date, over 1,331 income-eligible residents have received grants up to \$12,000 to help transition to clean mobility options.



Advancing \$1.6 million towards zero-emission commercial lawn and garden projects through the Charlene McGhee Memorial Lawn and Garden Program.



Celebrating the deployment of six new electric school buses for San Juan Unified School District.



Partnering on CALSTART's innovative POWER Hub project, introducing zero-emission equipment to off-road, remote job sites to advance clean energy goals.



Helping SacRT invest in 29 fuel-cell electric buses, the first in our region. This project is supported by a \$77 million federal grant and \$3 million in Air District funds.
