2. Period of Public Comment

Mr. Tona opened the floor to public comment; hearing none, the public comment period was closed.

3. Discussion of Permitting Issues, Caribou Biofuels

Mr. Simmons and Mr. Mitchell presented a 30-minute PowerPoint presentation detailing the advances to the mobile Inclined Rotary Gasifier (IRG) since spring. A question and answer period followed.

4. Approval of Minutes from the July 16, 2025 Meeting

MOTION: Ms. Roberts moved to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Ms. Allen, and the motion passed with no abstentions or objections.

5. Approval of Financial Status Report as of July 31, 2025

Ms. LaGrone submitted financial reports through July 31, 2025 and warrants to be paid.

Subject: Option b –Recognition of Current Fee Collection Practices

Background

California Health and Safety Code (HSC) §41866 authorizes the Sacramento Valley Basin to impose, and to require districts within the Sacramento Valley Air Basin to collect, a fee not to exceed five dollars (\$5) per permit. In Fiscal Year 2021–22, the Sacramento Valley Basin Control Council (SVBCC) established a committee to review its fee collection practices and, for FY 2022–23, adopted a fee structure intended to ensure consistent collection and forwarding of fees by all participating districts.

Because districts within the Basin employ different permitting practices, and because the minutes of the agenda from May 2022 were not clear, questions have arisen regarding whether multiple fees should be charged for facilities that are issued more than one Permit to Operate (PTO). Some districts issue a single PTO that covers all emissions units at a facility, while others issue separate PTOs for each emissions unit.

Clarification of Policy

After review and discussion, the TAC has confirmed that the adopted SVBCC fee structure shall be applied on the basis of **one fee per PTO issued by each District**, regardless of whether a facility holds a single consolidated PTO or multiple PTOs covering the same location.

This approach:

- **Aligns with HSC §41866**, which authorizes fees “per permit” rather than per facility or per emissions unit.
- **Respects local permitting practices**, allowing each District to maintain its method of issuing PTOs.
- **Maintains consistency** across the Basin in the way fees are calculated, reported, and remitted to the SVBCC.

This memorandum is intended to memorialize that practice for the record and to guide future fee reporting and collection.

Requested Action(s)

- a) **Informational Presentation** – Receive an overview of the Sacramento Valley Basin Wide Control Council (SVBCC) Fee Structure.
- b) **Possible Direction** – Formally recognize that the current collection practices are acceptable.
Or;
- c) **Possible Direction** – Formally adopt a uniform procedure for assessing and collecting the SVBCC fee to ensure consistency across all Districts.
Or;
- d) **Other Action** – Provide alternative direction as determined by the TAC.

Background

In Fiscal Year 2021–2022, the Sacramento Valley Basin Control Council (SVBCC) adopted a new fee structure to ensure that all fees were collected consistently and forwarded to the SVBCC. The fee review committee provided the following to the TAC prior to the meeting:

“The permit fee is actually the number of burn permits and permitted stationary sources that is reported by the Districts. Stationary sources are used in lieu of permits to account for the different methodologies used in permit unit determination by each district. This number is multiplied by \$5 for each district. The number of permits has increased as much as 74% in one district has decreased by 47% in another since FY 2011-2012.”

Minutes from the May 20, 2022, noted that “no assessment review was necessary”:

“Two additions to the proposed budget for FY2022-23 include a \$200 allotment for a Zoom account, and \$1100 to buy audio-visual equipment for meetings. A motion made by Mr. Tona to accept the proposed budget, with these additions and with no assessment review, was seconded by Mr. Ertle; the motion passed with no opposition or abstentions.”

In the budget years following FY22/23 no changes were made to the methods that Districts used to collect fees from sources for the SVBCC.

California Health and Safety Code (HSC) §41866 authorizes the assessment of fees up to \$5 per permit by each District.

Districts within the basin generally use two different approaches to permitting:

- **One permit per facility**, with all emissions units combined into a single permit, or
- **One permit per emissions unit** at a facility (facility defined as contiguous property under the control of the permittee).

The strictest reading of the HSC would require that each permit be charged the SVBCC fee.

Because the minutes during the May 2022 meeting did not clearly describe the process for Districts to collect and distribute fees for the SVBCC the TAC may wish to take one the following actions:

Proposed TAC Action

The TAC may wish to consider one of the following:

Formally recognize that the current collection practices are acceptable.; or

Formally adopt a uniform procedure for assessing and collecting the SVBCC fee to ensure consistency across all Districts.
