### MEETING MINUTES June 18, 2025

### 1. Call to Order / Roll Call / Introductions

A regular meeting of the Sacramento Valley Basinwide Air Pollution Control Council, Technical Advisory Committee was called to order by Chair Joe Tona at 1:33 pm via Zoom teleconference. Attendees were as follows:

Butte County AQMD – Patrick Lucey Colusa County APCD – Anastacia Allen Feather River AQMD – Chris Brown Glenn County APCD – Marcie Skelton Placer County APCD – Erik White Sacramento-Metropolitan AQMD – Alberto Ayala, Amy Roberts Shasta County AQMD – Rob Stahl Tehama County APCD – Joe Tona Yolo-Solano AQMD – Gretchen Bennitt

SMP Coordinator – Kai Tawa California Air Resources Board – Adam Gerber *PEEPs – absent* BCC Secretary-Treasurer – Laurie LaGrone

### 2. Period of Public Comment

Mr. Tona opened the floor to public comment; hearing none, the public comment period was closed.

### 3. Approval of Minutes from the May 21, 2025 Meeting

**MOTION:** Mr. White moved to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Ayala, and the motion passed with no objections.

### 4. Approval of Financial Status Report as of May 31, 2025

Ms. LaGrone submitted financial reports through May 31, 2025 and warrants to be paid. **MOTION:** Mr. Brown moved to approve the financial reports as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Ayala, and the motion passed with no objections.

<< Ms. Skelton joined the meeting at this point >>

#### 5. **RFP for Audit** – BCC/TAC Secretary-Treasurer

Ms. LaGrone presented an RFP for audit services spanning four years. After discussion it was decided that Butte AQMD and Joe Tona will make the selection of the auditor.

**MOTION:** Mr. Brown moved to approve the RFP for an audit spanning four years, 2022-23 through 2025-26, with dates as presented, and to permit the contracted auditor to present the final audits to the BCC board via Zoom. The motion was seconded by Mr. Ayala, and the motion passed with no objections.

### 6. Status Reports

• <u>CAPCOA</u> – Mr. Tona reported that at the prior week's meeting, the HR committee proposed a comp study of salaries for district staff, and the Monitoring Committee proposed a mentorship program.

Other items discussed include a new calibration system required by the EPA, updates from CARB regarding residential devices, and three new sites being considered for future CAPCOA meeting locations and conferences,

- <u>PEEPs</u> no report.
- <u>CA Air Resources Board (CARB)</u> Mr. Gerber reported that CARB's legal team is looking into the permitting of the BurnBot and whether it should be considered Open Burning.
- <u>SMP Coordinator</u> Burn Coordinator Tawa has received about half of the 2025 planted rice acre totals, and in July will request off-season rice burn totals from districts.

### 7. **SMP Committee** – no report.

### 8. Draft, BCC Legislative Platform – Gretchen Bennitt

Ms. Bennitt presented a draft of a BCC legislative platform based on that of the Yolo-Solano AQMD, and agreed to email it to TAC members for comments. Comments will be due by the July TAC meeting; Mr. Tona volunteered to write a memo for the platform prior to the August 1<sup>st</sup> BCC meeting, and Mr. Tona and Ms. Bennitt will form the committee to develop the legislative platform for the December BCC meeting.

### 9. Biomass Utilization

- a. Draft letter for review: Climate Bond Funding Sacramento-Metro presented the letter for discussion. If TAC approves the letter it will move to the board for approval.
- b. SB 88 Progress Mr. White and Mr. Ayala will represent the BCC's position to the Legislature on June 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- c. Permit streamlining effort for mobile biomass units, including potential model rule development after a lengthy discussion it was decided that Ms. Roberts would approach Caribou Biofuels to begin a conversation about their permitting needs.
- d. Biomass-related projects no additional discussion.

### 10. Other Action Items from BCC Meeting

- a. Report at August 1st BCC meeting how district appropriations and expenditures are calculated after a discussion, an Excel spreadsheet from November of 2020 was located. Mr. Brown will work with the TAC Secretary to create a history of the fee structure for the July TAC meeting and August BCC meeting.
- b. Arrange meeting with Caribou Biofuels to learn about their business model and permitting needs Amy Roberts will contact Caribou Biofuels.
- c. Review progress on uniform permitting efforts done.

### 11. Colusa County Biomass Field Trip Review – Anastacia Allen

Ms. Allen provided a report, and added that the Colusa County Board of Supervisors were very pleased

with the attendance and interest from other area supervisors.

### 12. Member Reports and Future Agenda Items

Mr. Brown said that two biomass projects in the FRAQMD district are moving forward.

Mr. Brown also reported that the U.C. Ag Extension plans to determine emission factors for local feedstocks, as opposed to woods from elsewhere in the U.S., which may yield different emissions from west coast feedstocks.

### **EXPENDITURES:**

**Communications:** The communications account includes telephone, fax and messenger services charges.

**Office Expense:** The office expense account includes standard office supplies such as pens, pencils, paper, binders, envelopes, filing supplies, paper clips, postage and delivery and bank charges.

**Professional Services:** This account currently includes the BCC Burn Coordinator Contract with Fife Environmental.

Special Departmental Expenditure: This account includes the following sub-accounts:

<u>Administrative Services</u>: BCC Secretary/Treasurer/Records Custodian Contract with Butte County AQMD.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>: Miscellaneous administrative charges not covered in the Office Expense and Communications accounts. This includes the cost of public notices for the annual budget and smoke management program adoption hearings.

<u>Financial Audit</u>: This includes the cost of contracting for the annual outside audit. The BCC anticipates contracting with Smith & Newell, CPA.

<u>BCC Insurance</u>: This includes the cost of property and liability insurance for the BCC. The BCC currently does not have coverage.

In past years this account has also included other specialized services such as computer programming and aerial surveillance, however, these expenses are not currently budgeted for FY 2004/2005.

Food and Lodging: This account includes costs for refreshments at BCC meetings.

**Other:** This account includes any other expenditures not covered in another account, as approved by the BCC.

**Contingencies:** This account is established for unbudgeted expenditures which might arise during the fiscal year. The BCC may authorize transfers during the year from contingencies to an existing account or establish a new account or sub-account.

**Cash Reserves:** This account includes both funds encumbered in a prior fiscal year, but not spent, and unencumbered cash reserves.

### **REVENUE:**

**District Assessment:** This account includes the annual fee assessments received from each of the nine (9) member BCC districts. A fee formula is used which includes: base fee plus permit assessment plus a pro rata basin charge:

Base fee: \$1,000/district.

<u>Permit assessment</u>: \$5/permit/district. Permit totals include total ag burn permits issued and permitted stationary sources. Districts issuing stationary source permits by process or equipment will report only the number of stationary sources permitted. <u>Pro rata basin charge</u>: pro rata assessment based on the acreage distribution percentages in the smoke management program, necessary to make up the difference

**Interest:** This account includes interest earned on the BCC accounts. The BCC funds are maintained in a Bank of America money market account.
