Priority	Primary Organization Name	Project	Project Description
1	Sacramento Tree Foundation	South Sacramento Tree Alliance	The Sacramento Tree Foundation will partner with United Latinos to engage at least 500 community members along the Franklin Boulevard corridor, plant at least 1,000 trees, host 3 community planting events, and 2 tree care workshops in the AB617 South Sacramento-Florin Community over the course of 1 year.
2	Electric Transportation Community Development Corporation	Sacramento Community EV-olution Campaign	An education, outreach, and engagement initiative focused on electric vehicle (EV) adoption, inclusive of all forms of electric mobility, cars, trucks, buses, bikes, scooters, etc, targeting all residents in Sacramento County. The campaign uses focus groups, community organization partnerships, and digital outreach to raise awareness about EVs, conduct ride reviews, and encourage EV adoption.
3	La Familia Counseling Center, Inc.	The Maple Park	The Maple Park Project to transform a neglected soccer field behind the Maple Neighborhood Center into a revitalized mini-park and community gathering space. This project addresses environmental disparities and lack of green space in an underserved neighborhood. The park renovation includes planting shade trees, installing water-efficient irrigation, native pollinator plants, updated play areas, fitness equipment, and a community garden.

4	Southgate Recreation & Park District	Building Green & Healthy in South Sacramento	The Building Green and Healthy in South Sacramento project aims to improve environmental conditions and public health through targeted park improvements, tree planting, and community education in the AB 617 South Sacramento – Florin community. The project includes renovations at multiple park sites to increase accessibility, encourage active lifestyles, and enhance green infrastructure. Tree planting and water-efficient landscaping will reduce urban heat, sequester carbon, and improve air quality. In partnership with the Sacramento Tree Foundation, the project will also engage the public through educational outreach about local air quality issues and the role residents can play through tree planting and green practices.
5	Sacramento Area Bicycle Advocates	ElectriCycle Sacramento	SABA, in collaboration with local bike shops and community-based organizations (CBOs) like Civic Thread, Sacramento TMA, Jibe, and Breathe CA, is launching an e-bike voucher program targeting low-income residents in North and South Sacramento. Building on prior outreach and education efforts, the project aims to distribute e-bike vouchers to up to 50 households. The goal is to encourage residents to replace car trips with e-bike rides for daily errands, thereby reducing traffic congestion and air pollution.
6	Sacramento Food Bank and Family Service	Lowering Carbon Emissions and Enhancing Air Quality Through the Transition from Gasoline to Electric Vehicles	This project proposes to replace two gasoline-powered vehicles used by the Sacramento Food Bank with electric vehicles. The goal is to reduce tailpipe emissions from the organization's transportation operations while continuing to support food distribution throughout the community.
7	United Latinos	Healthy Air, Healthy Homes – AB617 Indoor Air Quality Empowerment project	This 12-month initiative, led by United Latinos, aims to improve indoor air quality for 200 households within the AB 617 Sac Florin community. The project provides indoor air samplers and high-efficiency air purifiers, along with bilingual and culturally tailored education on sources of indoor pollution and mitigation practices.

8	Mutual Housing	Indoor Air Quality Study and Mutual Housing California	The Indoor Air Quality Study at Mutual Housing California will assess and improve indoor air conditions at a low-income senior housing complex through monitoring, education, and distribution of air purifiers and monitors at Wong center on 7th street. It will gather data, engage residents, and produce findings to guide future air quality improvements in similar communities.
9	Veritable Good	Community Active Transportation Equity Program	This project aims to build an active transportation network in disadvantaged communities across Sacramento. It promotes a culture of biking through community events like bike parties (first one in South Sacramento), increases access to bicycles and related equipment by supporting local bike shops, and provides education on how residents can advocate for equitable transportation in their neighborhoods.
10	Mutual Assistance Network	Together Outdoors	The Together Outdoors Project will complete the renovation of the backyard at the Firehouse Community Center (810 Grand Avenue) by removing asphalt and planting native vegetation and trees to create a social and environmental hub.
11	United Latinos	Raices Fuertes – Latino youth Environmental Leadership Initiative	This project, Raices Fuertes, is a one-year environmental justice leadership program engaging Latino youth (30-50 per year) within the Sacramento AB 617 Florin CERP boundaries. It focuses on building environmental literacy, advocacy skills, and civic participation through workshops, projects, and mentorship, empowering youth to lead local air quality and climate justice efforts.
12	United Latinos, Promoviendo Accion Civica	Eco Mural – Community Art for Environmental Justice	This 18-month project will create a large-scale, community-designed environmental justice mural within the AB 617 Sac Florin area-potentially in the old Campbell Soup Factory. The process involves extensive community engagement through listening sessions and design workshops, followed by public painting events with selected local muralists. The mural aims to visually capture residents' stories and aspirations around clean air and environmental justice, becoming a lasting educational and cultural landmark.

13	Soil Born Farms Urban Agriculture and Education Project	Edible City Initiative: Improving Air Quality through Regenerative Urban Agriculture	This project by Soil Born Farms focuses on empowering urban residents, especially youth and disadvantaged communities, with resources, education, and hands-on experience in regenerative urban food production and composting at their Rancho Cordova Farm. It aims to improve community health and environmental sustainability through education, resource distribution, and demonstration of climate-friendly food growing practices in in the Sacramento Area, with an emphasis on schools in the South Sacramento and Rancho Cordova.
14	Southgate Recreation & Park District	Going Green for South Sacramento Parks	Over approximately 14 months, SRPD will replace gas-powered maintenance equipment—including mowers, utility carts, and handheld tools—with electric and autonomous versions to reduce emissions. The project also includes planting 50 shade trees to capture carbon and conducting a public education campaign to raise awareness of air quality improvements.
15	City of Elk Grove	Public EV Charging	This project proposes installing 15 public EV chargers at two locations in Elk Grove within the South Sacramento – Florin AB 617 community, including DC fast chargers and Level 2 units. It aims to increase equitable access to EV charging by offering reduced rates for low-income SMUD customers, thereby encouraging a shift from gasoline vehicles to zero-emission electric vehicles.
