Replaced a gas-operated generator with a solar-power generator for the Midtown Farmers Markets, reducing reliance on fossil fuels. Installed 24 bright purple bike racks across six locations and placed 28 large planters with drought-resistance plants along the Alhambra Corridor, creating a more pedestrian-friendly and environmentally sustainable space.	\$85,600	Completed December 2023
